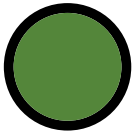
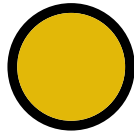


3 Responses



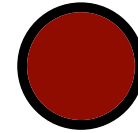
"Yes, I want to be saved"

- Explain the importance of their own faith and prayer (Rom. 10:9-10)
- Ask them about the Gospel
 - Do they believe the Gospel (Jesus death and resurrection?)
 - Do they believe that God can forgive their sin and save their soul?
- Ask them to pray or lead them in prayer for salvation.
- How can you know that Christ has saved you?
 - "All who call on His name will be saved" (Rom. 10:13)
- After the prayer, help them understand that "now that they know the truth, they should live in it"
 - The first act of obedience is baptism.
 - (John 10:10) - The thief wants to continue to destroy their lives, but God wants to give us abundant life - that life only comes in following Christ. We trust Him as Savior and make Him our Lord.



"I need to think about it"

- People may want to process what they've heard
 - Help them understand the seriousness of that decision (ask when was the last time they had a convo about Jesus or salvation?)
 - Today is the day of salvation - if God is leading you in this way, you should follow Him.
- You mentioned needing to think about it - that's a great idea
 - Could we meet this week to talk about it
 - Or - I meet with a couple of people every week to process life stuff, why don't you join us this week?
- Give them the napkin to keep - and PRAY for them.



"No"

- If someone isn't interested and gives a distinct "no"
 - Don't debate
 - Don't be offended
- Say "Thanks for listening to me", "if you will just remember Jesus loves you" and "if you ever find yourself in a place of brokenness, remember our conversation about the Gospel"
- Give them the napkin to keep - and PRAY for them.
